Mechanics changes: coaches turn in rosters to referees during pre-match conference

- -remind coaches to bring it to conference or they LOSE A RALLY
- \*\*preventive officiating can eliminate this frustrating situation from happening!

Lineups still are turned in at same times, but also go to the R2

Informal signals for back row attack: slight changes for "safe" signal

"Out on you" signal: if R2 calls a ball out on a joust or other situation, the R2 steps to the offending side, signals "out" and points with open hand to the offending side

Online Rules Review opens tomorrow: must get 100% or you start the presentation over New rules: see the PowerPoint for explanations and rationales

All line judges must move to the side along the baseline when a server is close to them 4-2-7: special emphasis on not changing any part of uniform top or bottom where we can see On sub-varsity tournaments the crew chief needs to find out from tournament director whether bracket matches will be 15 or 25 on the 3rd set

Uniform slides: it is an official's judgment; see PowerPoint

We will see a lot of new uniforms this year, just make sure they are clearly contrasting with the libero

Be on the lookout for things that may require a MSHSAA letter during pre-match; apparatuses, religious symbols, insulin pumps, etc

How do we decide what to talk about in meetings:

Ball handling was #1 item coaches brought up

-coaches want to see consistency throughout the match
