Overlaps:

5-1 serve receive:

coaches want setters to be closest to her setting position

-also want best passers to be in passing position

-when setter is middle back, probably most opportunity for overlaps

-between left and right back positions

-when setter is LB (left back), know who your CB player is before you blow your whistle

-when setter is front row, overlaps issues are less likely to happen (she is closer to her setting position)

-she can be moving when the ball is contacted, as long as she doesn't pass her neighbor before the ball is contacted

6-2 serve receive:

-2 setters always opposite each other

Don't guess! You need to be able to tell the coach which players are switched

-there's nothing wrong with waiting until the 2nd or 3rd occurrence to blow your whistle

Net/center line violations:

When the hit/block is closest to R2, it is sometimes difficult to see them

-R2 needs to have a logical, sequential way to check

-top to bottom: antenna—where the ball should pass; be at an angle where you can see tape, net, bottom of the net, then center line

"Up, down, away" watch players coming to the play, watch them go up, and then watch them go away from the net

-feel free to move table back if it is too close to the standard (if there is room)

-ideally R2 will call nets and center line violations

-center line boundary ends at the sideline; net violations happen anywhere on the net, inbounds or out

If there is mass confusion about a play, invite line judges and R2 over to the stand to discuss, make the call, and move on
